We had a circumstance in May, where two students were able to practice soul winning because a young man offended his classmate. She was so upset, she couldn't bring herself to even be in the same room with him, she didn't show up for school for days. As word got around, others got involved. By the time we caught wind, scandal had broken out. Sin was on a rampage, injuring and confusing; gossip and fear prevailed. Then came Jesus. I pulled two of the boys in at the same time, usually I work one on one but this time I knew one wasn't saved and the other was. He was trying to give his friend advice (albeit, after he became part of the problem by gossiping). We resolved after our meeting that apologies were in order immediately.

They would have to endure the long weekend knowing what they had to face. I met the girl Monday morning and asked her permission for the three of them and an adult to meet and resolve this. They could have chosen a different teacher, one that could listen to the conversation in Spanish and lead with accuracy and comprehension, but they didn't. As I sat in, I could only monitor the inflections, and a few words I knew piquing my interest. Before long, I had to interrupt the process. I explained that I didn't catch everything, but I could tell that the young lady wasn't convinced that the apology was sincere. I asked her to describe to him how she felt when he was around her. Within a few sentences, he was broken; sobbing and begging for her 'pardon'. It wasn't over yet, God was working and I sat in amazement, unable to contribute a single word.(cont.)
