I will always remember 2020 as the year the whole world went crazy! Where has all the time gone? It seems like just yesterday we were at LMCS busy with preparation as we anticipated the opening of a new school year and already the first semester is over. The teachers and staff were all sent home two days before President Vizcarra actually made the official announcement for the nation wide mandatory lockdown.

Watching a spider cast the first lines of her construction for a web hanging from the light fixture, Kris and I sit captivated by its God-given abilities to build such a web. When has there been such an abundance of time to reflect on the smallest details of God's creation? Whether in a barn-loft or in a kings palace the spider looks for an opportune spot to build a web with the intentional

design meant to capture its prey. Later on, we equate the intricate weaving of the stings in the spiders web as a representation to the moments, hours, days, weeks, and now months that seem to be running together for us like a spiders web. 
"He who believes what he knows, shall soon know more clearly what he believes"



Occasionally, destitute people from our surrounding communities will ring our doorbell asking for food and clothing. We try to keep bags filled to meet the basic food essentials for survival. As the grocery bags of food pass from our hands to theirs, we are given opportunity to share the truth of the gospel. While some are clearly only interested in subsidies to meet their physical needs, others are open to the gospel. This is what ministry is all about. Despite their intentions, God brings them to our door and we love them because Christ loves us.

Kris has had some great opportunities open up for ministry to a community through his car mechanic. Also, as Kris teaches his students at LMCS, our prayer has been that the students would apply what is taught in Bible class in a very practical sense.
