One facet to prayer is the heart's preparation for Understanding and Accepting God's Will.

There are several levels of ministry. Many of them are behind the scenes like new outreach preparation and maintaining relationships with the unsaved, as well as with fellow believers.

Our desire is to glorify the Lord, not ourselves as we are accountable to the Lord for the ministry He gave us, and gives us with ample opportunities to bring Him glory even through the mundane things of daily living.

The time between November and the New Year are especially challenging. It is a good time to review the past year and work on implementing plans for this upcoming year. The *Prayer Letter and Update* we organize also has stories and difficulties behind the scenes we are dealing with, but we can't possibly fit all those details in.

Our daughter, Lydia, visited us during the holiday (She is seated in the enclosed photo on the right in the children's class that Rose Marie helps with.) Rose Marie came down with the Flu the first week Lydia was with us and Lydia caught it the next week. In spite of that, we were able to deliver gifts to our small group in Cerro Azul and were glad for the opportunity to participate in the Christmas Program in Ate. Spanish classes were suspended for three weeks so we and our teacher could participate in holiday activities. (Praise the Lord for Spanish classes we have been able to fit into our schedule this month).

We count it a privilege and a blessing to be a part our church community at Iglesia Bautista La Fe (*Faith Baptist Church*) in Ate [pronounced Ah-Tey]

The Pastor which we saw installed in 2016, is Daniel Aguilar; He is developing Missions Minded ministry outreaches. Last year a new Mission Church was established in Huachipa (you might recognize the name from the October *Prayer Letter and Update*. Pastor Aguilar is now putting together a group, from the members in Ate for another Mission Church as they did in Huachipa. The members will canvass the village of Cerro Azul with us and will meet our small group of believers. We are also looking at a new contact for possible housing in the province of Cañete. It is a huge move! Lots of energy will be needed. We are also praying for a national couple to help us with the start-up who God may lead to full time pastorate.

We requested two evaluations to send for Pastor Phelps, Pastor David Stockard, Jeremy Lockhart and Dr. John O' Malley to read an pray over. One evaluation is from our Spanish instructor and another from Pastor Aguilar. We want their honest options as to where we are regarding our language skills. Those evaluations will be discussed Monday, January 27. We would appreciate prayer for God to lead them as they give us counsel.

It is always difficult for me to say, "Sorry. No, I can't do it this time" to the many doors of ministry opportunities during the summer months. While I had to decline speaking at a Family Camp, as I write this update, we are very involved with and working together with likeminded missionary's here in Antioquia at the MK (Missionary Kid) Camp.

Pray for the unsaved we have been witnessing to; Carlos Boyer, Miguel Norabuena, and The Garcia family. Please pray for Pierre, our ministry co-worker we had in Cerro Azul. He was hospitalized for a few days. I visited him at his home last week. He would appreciate your continued prayers for his health and return to ministry.

Pray for safety for us as we travel back to Lima and the safety of the campers while they are under our care. Earlier this week the bus that was transporting the campers broke an axle on the rough road to Antioquia. Rose Marie and I were following in the vehicle we just acquired last month and thankfully were there to use it to take campers the rest of the way.

Although we are learning a lot in Spanish classes, Pray for our upcoming language evaluations. We will be attending a quinceñera on the 8th of February. Rose Marie will be the hair stylist for the bride and her wedding party on the February 15th. February 22 we have scheduled a canvassing trip to Cerro Azul with the families of La Fe. These are just a few of the irons in the fire. Prayerfully, remember to ask the Lord for Souls to be won and believers edified through us in the Cerro Azul ministry and during the camp.
