MISSIONARIES TO THE ISLAND OF POHNPEI

Health has certainly been as issue since our arrival in Pohnpei. This past year especially, from having numerous boils to getting an abscessed tooth drilled out without any numbing medication, I have experienced some of the worst pain I can remember. God, however, really encouraged me as I was teaching through Thessalonians at the Baptist Bible Institute of Pohnpei with 1Thess 3:3 "That no man should be moved by these afflictions: for yourselves know that we are appointed thereunto." Paul had been chased out of Thessalonica by the unbelieving Jews, and the Christians who were left there were still facing persecution. He reminds them that "afflictions" and trials are not only a part of life that we face, but also are something we are "appointed" to, a divine appointment. For only through the avenue of trials can we grow stronger (Rom 5:4), can we learn to depend on God more (2 Cor 1:4), and can we develop more in our goal of Christ-likeness (Job 23:10). When you think of that way, one can see why Peter would say in 1Pe 1:7 "That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth..." Praise God for His love and care and for the "divine appointments" He sends our way that allow us to grow as Christians.

As many of you probably already know, Pastor Rickson Kihleng's mom, Shrue Kihleng, passed away the beginning of April. Although we mourn her absence, we are thankful she now is at home with her Saviour. The Lord also blessed and we were able to see a man who had come to the funeral make a profession of faith as the gospel was shared with him.

We have been working on getting the church ready to be chartered. We finished writing the church constitution and bylaws and have fulfilled the legal requirements. Lord willing, once those documents are translated into Pohnpeian and discussed thoroughly with the church, we hope to have the chartering service soon thereafter.

They were both such a blessing to us and we already miss them immensely, but we are excited to see what the Lord has for their futures.
