MISSIONARIES TO THE ISLAND OF POHNPEI

It is very encouraging to know that even when we face uncertainties and when things happen for which we did not plan, God is never surprised and He will always be there to lead and guide us through whatever we face in this life. We did not anticipate a series of expensive repairs and replacements all happening together, and yet, as always, God provides. We needed tires on the van for a while, but since a new set costs almost \$200 per tire, we had been saving up for replacements. Then the refrigerator, which had been hanging on for over a year, finally died. The stove, brake pads, radiator, and thermostat on our van also went out. BUT, God is faithful and even allowed some churches and individuals to contact us out of concern and help us out tremendously with some of these needs. What a blessing to see God work (Psalm 37:25) and know that He is ever on the throne and never surprised. He already had ways of provision for us and we thank Him, as well as those He used to help with what happened, some of which was so unexpected.

Living in a 3rd world country, we sometimes encounter things which would be unusual in * Praise the Lord for the souls that the States. One such thing I wanted to mention as a prayer request. About 7 months ago we tore down a tin porch roof off the church where people would gather before and after services and where we would have fellowships. The tin had holes for years and the damage to the porch from the leaks and termites prevented salvaging any materials. The plan was to cut down a big tree right next to the old porch and build a new one a little bit bigger and with better drainage to help the new one last longer. A power line touches the tree so we went to the power company and paid the ten dollars for them to come out and take down the line so we can cut the tree down which had caused some of the damage to the roof from its falling limbs and fruit. The power company said they would come out, but even after going to them an additional 20-25 times and hearing the same story that they will come out the following week, the power line remains. We really miss the porch and want to build it so we can have a place out of the rain for fellowships, but we are still waiting on the power company to do their job.
