Many thanks to those who took the time to pray that the Lord would move the power company to take care of a power line problem touching the big tree very close to the church that was preventing us from making repairs to the building. Months kept going by as promise after promise to come fix the line was never fulfilled. It was not very reassuring to be informed that another Baptist church about an hour away was still having to use candle lights for their evening service because two years have passed since they requested for power to be run to the church. But I am glad we serve a living God who hears our petitions and can accomplish His will despite the odds or obstacles. We praise the Lord that He answered prayer and progress has been made. The power company came out two days and cut off many limbs of the huge tree. It was mango season and the tree was loaded with green mangos, so everyone was able to take their fill. It is a good thing that we were able to put up the church sign a few months ago, because we can no longer use the description, "the building under the huge mango tree" to identify the church building. Later the power company returned again to take care of the power line. We are thankful to now be able to begin * Pray for several of our supporting the building projects. Both his brothers were able to also go down with him to deliver supplies

and help that week building the foundation for the missionary's house. Meetings have been going well on the island and we praise the Lord for the souls that have been saved there since the work started this last year. Please do pray for Kyle as he makes this transition and that the Lord would direct him specifically in his life.

We worked on a church constitution and Pastor Rickson Kihleng has recently been explaining it on Sunday nights to ensure people know the beliefs of the church. We plan to have a church chartering service on March 13th. We also plan to have the first business meeting and adopt a budget in the near future. These concepts are very unfamiliar here and we are thankful for the direction we see the church heading.
