We are very grateful to all that have given toward Ambassador's new church building. We were excited to hear that work has begun on functioning bathrooms since the church has had to rent a porta-potty on multiple occasions. Praise the Lord that another step has been taken toward this goal.

My health continues to be a persistent problem. We have prayed, pondered, and sought advise from others for long term solutions. We have prayed and fasted for the Lord's leading and do not have peace to pursue surgery at this time. Currently I am having physical therapy which has encouraged us as I seem to have a bit more mobility. However, progress is slow and I am not able at this time, nor will I in the near future be able to do the work of the ministry. It is with very heavy hearts that my wife and I have come to the conclusion to step down. We both believe time is short, and that the need is great. Funneling your sacrificial giving toward other couples and/or families may be a better use of God's money.

I do honestly believe we have had some of the best churches in the world to partner with during our time in service together. You have been so faithful in your giving and uplifting us in your prayers. Some sent cards and notes of encouragement. Individuals and pastors contacted us for personal prayer requests. Others sent boxed of goodies - the kids would always get very excited when receiving them from the post office. Altogether your support has been above and beyond. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts. Although we can never repay your kindness, we know that your faithfulness to the Lord is seen by Him. We look forward in anticipation to the time when the Lord will reward you all Himself.

Please pray for Christa and our youngest son, Kaleb as they will try to get tickets to go back to Pohnpei and sell what we have there before returning here. It is impossibly difficult to express how much we all will miss our Pohnpeian family.
