The highlight of the trip for Kaleb was spending a week at youth camp while I sorted paperwork, schoolwork, and other exciting things that he didn't get to help me with. We left the island with teary eyes and hurting hearts, but we will be forever grateful that the Lord allowed us the tremendous privilege of serving Him in Pohnpei and the blessing of developing relationships with people whose friendships we treasure. Many we know we will see again in Heaven and others we pray will soon make that personal decision to repent of their sin and accept Jesus Christ as their Saviour. After a while a Japanese lady named Reenee came to get her things, but her locker would not open either. She told us that she knew where to get help and that she would go ask. When she was gone, Kaleb mentioned that maybe she was the reason for our delay. When she returned she mentioned that her things were in storage because she had missed her flight the day before. We told her that we believed that God has a purpose for everything and that we were thankful He allowed us the opportunity to meet her and that we had something we would like to give her. She very excitedly accepted the cellphone-themed tract that we offered and exclaimed how much she loved it because she worked in marketing for a tech company in Germany. She said that she would read it. The locker attendant arrived and opened both of our lockers and we went on our way just in time to arrive for boarding our next flight.

At the end of our next flight the lady sitting next to me told me that she thought God wanted us to sit next to each other. She had missed her flight from the day before and also that day her seat assignment had been changed, as had ours. She told me, "Even though I am from Thailand, I think I am one of the few there that believe in God and you keep talking about Him." We were able to give her a gospel tract and she asked if we could exchange contact information in case she had more questions. She seems very interested, but confused. Please pray for Sunny's salvation.

What an encouragement, comfort, and motivation to know the all-knowing, all-powerful God of eternity that loved us enough to send His Son to die for our sins, also has a plan for our future and will direct our steps.
