Our month has been one of challenges and opportunity. We thank God that He gives us the strength and ability to meet with both.

Nikki has had severe morning sickness, so that has been a bit of a challenge for us. We are very thankful that she seems to have made a complete recovery from her case of amoebas, but she has still had to sit out of language school for a little while. We are also thankful for my sister Elizabeth's assistance during this time in helping care for Joshua. That has allowed me to continue in my studies and other responsibilities. Please pray that Nikki will be well enough soon to resume studying.

I have had a hard time meeting with some of our previous contacts, but God allowed me to meet and spend a lot of time with a young man named Sineth. On the day we met him, he showed much interest, and I was able to meet with him several times. One of his first questions was, "Can Jesus help me with my problems?" Often when we hear this question, people are referring to money problems. As Sineth continued though, I realized he was concerned about his sin problem. Over the course of a few meetings, I shared the Gospel with him as clearly as I could. He promised to come to church last week, but did
