A fairly popular treat here in Cambodia is "pong tia kon", a hard boiled, partiallydeveloped duck egg. They are easy to come by and are usually seasoned with a blend of spices (pepper, salt, and MSG). While my husband was studying the Bible with a man in the village last month, I was able to sit with his wife and learn how to make this "spice concoction." As you can see in this picture, they use a stone hand mill to grind the spices. It takes a great deal of work to crank the handle around, but produces enough spice to last about a month. This is a very important task for this lady's business. I'm thankful for the opportunity to learn some Khmer traditions while building new relationships.
