Artiss Update:

The doctors are continuing to restretch her esophagus monthly. She is currently going about three weeks before she has a choking issue. The doctors are hoping to get this time between procedures extended by quite a bit in the next few months.

We met with Artiss' Neurologist team in February to review the results from all her MRI and EMG tests from the last several months. Artiss DOES NOT have any neurological or spinal disease/disorder affecting her swallowing or pain she is having in her feet. Everything, even blood tests, came back NORMAL! All those big and scary diagnoses that we were told were a strong possibility have been removed by the power of prayer! Artiss has been diagnosed with benign Tongue Fasciculation. The doctor said: "That's because she is a unique little girl!" Yes, yes she is! They do not believe the fasciculation will grow any worse or cause any issues, other than an annoyance. Her swallowing/esophageal issue is a separate problem and IS NOT connected to her tongue or anything neuro. It was discovered that Artiss' left leg is longer than her right leg and that her spine is curving. The Neuro team believes this is the culprit of the peripheral neuropathy and crippling leg pain she is experiencing. This is FIXABLE! We have been referred to an orthopedic specialist and we will be meeting with them in April.

We are so thankful for each of you that have come alongside us to intercede in prayer on behalf of our little girl! We are praising God for answering our prayers, exceedingly and abundantly above!
