These volunteers, along with the three ladies who help Carolyn in the ladies' cell block, make it possible for us to have six different services in six different cell blocks at the same time.

Thanks to Brother and Sister Devall's faithfulness at the Prison over the past twelve years, the chaplain there has asked Joe to try to find someone who speaks Spanish to hold Spanish services at the Pender Correctional Institute in Burgaw twice a month.
