Dear Friends and Co-Laborers,

Sorry we are late with our regular letter, but time has left us in the dust again. We have been very busy this summer, and heading into the fall, the promise seems to be for more of the same. When we wrote in June we were only days from a trip to Florida for our Mission Board's annual meeting. A supporting church in New York has asked us to come if our schedule brings us up in that area.

We have just returned from the annual meeting in Richmond of the Virginia Association of Independent Baptists. It was a very good meeting where we heard reports on this past year's activities in the Virginia State Legislature and also a look at what may be expected in the coming session. Speakers at this meeting each year keep pastors and others apprised of developments and their effects on the churches and their ministries. This V.A.I.B. meeting emphasizes and illustrates what we already know – we live in a world vastly different from just a few years ago.

Please pray that, as we travel to schools and talk to students and others, many will seriously consider the Lord's claim on their lives, whether or not His will for them is missionary service. The fields at home and abroad "are white unto harvest." THE HOUR IS LATE!
