Dear Friends and Co-Laborers,

In checking our calendar it looks like it's time for an update. In order to do that we pulled out our last couple of letters to see what we needed to bring you up-to-date on. In March we mentioned a potential trip into the upper Mid-Atlantic states and Southern New England. In July, while at the Sword of the Lord Conference representing World Wide, we met the president of one of the colleges we anticipated visiting. He gave us contact information for a visit and suggested we might be able to speak to their missions classes. We wanted to make that trip possibly this fall, in conjunction with two other schools (one in Maryland and one in Pennsylvania) and a church in New York whose pastor had told us that if we got up that way to be sure to come to their church as well.

We now realize a fall trip up in that area will not be possible and will have to be put on hold until after the first of the year. The reason for the change is that the "checkerboard" has come out again and we expect to be in Korea beginning next month until the middle of January. We had been asked to consider this last year, but changes overseas necessitated us putting it on the "back burner." There is a missionary pastor in South Korea who needs to come to the U.S. for a couple of months or so. We have told the board that we will take his place until January, 2010. The church ministers mostly to military personnel at a base in Waegwan near Daegu. How is that for a change in direction? The Lord keeps surprising us with a variegated ministry. We fly out of Richmond to Atlanta (I've heard it said that even the Rapture will go through Atlanta). We then fly from Atlanta non-stop to Tokyo (no "twinkling of an eye" there) and from Tokyo to Busan (Pusan), Korea.

On another front concerning Majuro – the Bucks are now there. Praise the Lord! In just about 15 months of deputation, they are now on the field. They are very busy getting their place to live in order, getting their "feet on the ground," opening the school year (including the 10th grade for the first time), and meeting the requirements of the Marshallese government. We just received a note from them saying that they are adjusting and that the big shipment of books from A Beka had arrived. We know that Pastor Lang and those in the church and school are breathing a sigh of relief at having the Bucks finally there to help.

We have a number of meetings scheduled between now and our departure to Korea, so the remaining weeks promise to be very busy. Your continued prayer and support are, as always, a great blessing! All praise to our faithful God for His never-failing grace!
