Dear Friends and Co-Laborers,

In Majuro things seem to be going well but everybody is simply overloaded. They have opened the 11<sup>th</sup> grade. The last I talked to them they had about 317 students and were anticipating perhaps a few more. The desperate need for more personnel continues unabated. One man was interested in coming to teach in the high school, but difficulties with immigration made it impossible. So-o-o, back to "square one." The Bucks seem to be doing well – that we can tell from increased efficiency in ordering and handling supplies, etc. If any of you who read this are also supporting the Bucks, our deepest gratitude and appreciation to you!

Once again, "Thank you" for your prayers and support for us and the ministry of God's Word around the world. What a blessing you are! May God bless you all.
