The people were excited at what the Lord is doing there. In each service they had first time visitors, and their evening service was larger than the morning service – and with more visitors. We were much encouraged to see that work going and growing.

Since we got back home, we have been in several meetings and conferences. In one we used the Sunday School time to bring the church up to date on the work in Majuro. We then preached the morning service, and in the evening service we covered the work in South Korea and Italy. We are also having opportunities to do some teaching and pulpit supply. We are trying to schedule a trip to several small Bible Colleges in the Mid-West. Trying to get these scheduled for a minimum of travel is not always easy. There are also a couple of meetings scheduled for the summer and early fall. If we can be of help in any way in meetings, conferences, or otherwise, please let us know. We would count it an honor to be of assistance.
