We had a very eventful October and November and have a lot to fit into this brief update. First, Nora and I are so excited to announce that we are expecting a precious little one due June 21st. Many of you will remember that we had a 14 week miscarriage in January. We are nearing that milestone and appreciate your prayers for safety and health for both Nora and our little munchkin. We are so very thankful for this precious life.

On November 1st, after finishing a meeting in Virginia and heading back toward the Mid-West for more meetings, a car pulled out in front of us and I was unable to avoid it which resulted in our faithful Buick being totaled. God's protection was evident from the time that we exited the vehicle to see how only a few inches of difference could have made the accident much more serious. We praise the Lord that Nora (and the baby), myself, and the passengers of the other vehicle were unharmed during the incident.
