The continuation of the seminary is encouraging as among the three churches in the interior of Bahia that are involved there are about 35 students. I told one of my men that these trips are physically exhausting, but spiritually refreshing. Every time I make a trip to the interior for seminary, I return being blessed by my students.

Those who helped with the purchase of the children's school DVD's will be interested to learn that Aydan, Daniella, and Abigail absolutely love this method of schooling. Of course, who wouldn't love to get to "watch" TV while doing your schoolwork? The relief it gives Cynthia is a blessing as well as giving us the joy of "watching" Abigail and Daniella quoting their Bible verses. They all three love to tell us about their "friends" on their videos.
