Several new contacts were made which we hope to see produce Bible studies which will lead to evangelistic fruit. I made another seminary trip to the interior and taught the doctrines of bibliology, angelology, and eschatology. From the interior, I flew to Salvador and traveled to the city of Porto de Sauípe where I spent the week teaching creation science to a wonderful little church. The church treated me with such wonderful hospitality and listened



intently as we studied the first 11 chapters of Genesis together. I returned home to get back to the responsibilities

of the congregation. Visits have been a priority with several regular members suffering from illnesses. The services remain well attended even though we are in our rainy season. Unfortunately, the rain is light and so it does not alleviate the drought, but it does reduce the heat which is nice. In June, one of my men came to me with the idea of beginning evangelization in two schools close by. He made some contacts and both administrators have opened the door for us to come and present the gospel to the students who will range in age from 12 to 18 years.

Please be in prayer for this endeavor. We are lookina



forward to having Joel Smothers to come visit with us again in September and we have heard good news about his deputation. Continue to pray for Cynthia's health as she is experiencing some symptoms of fatique for which we have not found a reason. Finally we ask that you pray as we continue searching for land and need to build. We have begun a building fund with our mission if anyone would like to help. May God bless each of you. He truly does work with us even though we don't deserve it.
