Enduring Mercy

Psalm 136:1 O give thanks unto the Lord: for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever.

We made it safely home with ALL of our bags. Of course arriving "home" after 10 months means days of cleaning, arranging, unpacking and just settling in. God has been able to help us get settled in and unpacked as well as get back to the routine of homeschool and ministry. Through a dear supporting church in Texas, the Lord has provided help with a printer for a national pastor in the Amazon so that we can help him begin seminary classes with his men. Then last week we got word from a supporting church in Virginia about a sacrificial gift of \$20,000 toward our building fund! And the Lord has sent much needed rain! Truly we do not deserve such mercy, but we praise the Lord for His continued blessings! A huge "thank you" goes out to all of you who have and are praying for us and support us so sacrificially. We are amazed at the mercies of the Lord!
