Were any of y'all in AWANAs? Maybe some of you still are! Wednesday nights at the church where I spent most of my childhood were some of my favorites. Recently, as I was listening to the last chapter of Romans and all of the specific people who Paul greets and remembers there, I was taken back to my AWANA days. Although those days are far behind me now (we won't go into just HOW far!), when I was a Cubbie/Spark/Chum/Guard/JV (those rank names probably date me enough!), AWANA stood for Approved Workmen Are Not Ashamed. And to go along with that acronym, II Timothy 2:15 is indelibly etched in my memory. As I listened to Romans 16, the following words perked my ears, "Salute Apelles approved in Christ." A quick search revealed that he, Apelles, is

the only man in the New Testament aside from Jesus Christ to be specifically designated in such a way. Yes, we see Paul encouraging those in his fledgling churches and demonstrating just how to strive for the stamp of God's approval, but only Apelles is recorded as "approved." It would be easy to spend time wondering how he came to merit that status and/or lamenting that we don't know more about him; but our all-wise God chose to keep the details a secret. You know, I believe it's quite probable that Apelles was approved because, despite the pull of the flesh, he strove to do and think and be, quite simply, what God asked of him - day by day, moment by moment, in situations either mundane or extraordinary. And maybe God didn't give us the details illustrating how or why Apelles was approved, because it's not for us to copy someone else's life but, rather, to pattern our own as HE lays it out. With the Bible as our how-to guide and with prayer to whittle away that which hinders our walk with Him, perhaps one day God will be able to stamp us, like Apelles, "approved."
