In Her Words - Cynthia Dickens



What do you do when you have no one to talk to? Maybe that's a little simplistic, because I don't mean the simple act of "talking." I guess I mean communication, in all of its complexities. There are so many people who find themselves in the situation of having no one with whom they can communicate, and I don't pretend to think that the application of what I'm about to say is easy in any way. Neither do I pretend to think this is a new breakthrough on the subject. Rather, it's something of which I have to constantly remind myself. God is enough.

Yes, I know it to be unfailingly true. But there are moments when I'm standing figuratively alone in the midst of a situation that breaks my heart and demands I find a shoulder to cry on, but I know that finding such a shoulder would serve no godly purpose but may even worsen things, in the

long run. It's emotionally and physically draining (THAT may be the understatement of the century!) to be teetering on the fulcrum of the "how can I bear this?" seesaw ... casting desperate glances all about, looking for someone to help me balance, to share the burden, to cast a lifeline ... yet to know that, despite all of the precious, caring, praying people about me, none can provide what I need. Only God is enough.

Only He knows me better than I know myself. Only He will listen patiently to my flawed view of things (even though His knowledge of both my side and all other sides is perfect). Only He will keep my sin-tainted, natural-human-response words and thoughts and opinions secret. And He does all of this in order to console, correct, and encourage me onward, as needed. Only He knows the path on which He's leading me and what the end of our walk holds. Only He stops at times to huddle with me in a place that feels so crowded, yet so shut off. Only He offers true release from the bonds of despair and despondency.

Please, don't mistake my meaning here. In no way am I encouraging anyone reading this to shun Biblical counsel offered by those around you. There is nothing wrong (rather, there is everything RIGHT) with seeking guidance from a godly leader in your life. Without a doubt, God can use someone else to comfort, encourage, and correct us in accordance with His Word. My thoughts here reference those times that so many face on a regular basis - times when those to whom we would run may be hurt in their own spiritual walk by our struggles, times when the well-meaning sympathy of others may be what our flesh would like but may not be what our spirit needs, times when those we deemed trustworthy are suddenly and quite irreversibly NOT, and the list could go on.

But the truth remains, no matter how desperate the situation; and I cannot survive without the near-constant reminder that ... God is enough ... for me and for you.

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
