I'm no longer the van ministry director but I still overseer the discipleship and college/career ministries for now. The van ministry was what took most of my attention so that had to go first. The other two don't take much of my time. Whenever I'm home from deputation, I'm still teaching a weekly Bible study on Wednesdays at Gallaudet University in DC (the only deaf university in the world). My sending church would appreciate it if you could pray for them to have more workers since they were already understaffed before I started transferring my responsibilities away. As my deputation takes me to churches further and further, my duties here will continue to diminish.

We went to a missions conference at Liberty Baptist Church in Philadelphia where I met another missionary to the deaf (in Ecuador). He knows more Ecuadorian sign language than American sign language but we managed to communicate. It was quite encouraging and we plan to keep in touch. Most of the meetings I made appointments are for the coming months during the Fall season when I will have them almost every week. We attended a regional conference in



southern New Jersey called the Northeast Vision Summit hosted by Solid Rock Baptist Church where we got the opportunity to meet several pastors from the area and schedule visits with them as well. On our way to Valley Baptist Church in Edinburg, VA, we took a brief detour on the Skyline Drive, our first time there. We were quite delighted to learn that route was free for deaf folks as we came in. The park rangers even gave me a card that will also give me the same free access to all national parks!
