It is been a very busy but fruitful summer. Thank God and thank you all for your prayers. Reminiscing on the months of June and July, I echoed what one author said...."much prayer, much power, little prayer, little power and no prayer, no power". We truly serve a great and wonderful God! He saved us from our sins. He supplies what we need in order to serve Him (1Pe 4:11 ... "if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability **which God giveth"**:). And He also rewards us.

We are privileged to have our young man and all our young women who had gone to Bible College to come for summer vacation. Last week when many of them started to leave for college, the church people acknowledged that they had helped a lot during the summer. They had helped with the Baptist churches' summer camp. They helped with Sunday school, preaching (in our church and other Baptist churches as well) and Vacation Bible School. God had saved three young people from our church during the summer camp and several children during the Vacation Bible School. Pray for these young people and children and pray for their parents' that they may come to know God as their personal Lord and Savior. Rom 10:1 Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved.

The following are some prayer requests. Please pray with me, my wife and the church people for these matters:

God has been so good to my family all these years! We are privileged to live in a house where another missionary family (The Schell's family) had build. We knew that day would come and it's finally coming to the end of the land lease. Linda and I want to build something on my parent's land. We could not build on the new property because of the present situation or opposition we are facing. I don't want my children to face that again. The land we are currently staying has land dispute- a dispute that started even before my wife and I moved here. I remember one time after Linda and I (no children yet) came from town and our doors (the parsonage and the church) had pad locks and we were not able to go inside the two building. We knew it was the landlord. Some times later, they came with their machetes standing outside our windows and arguing to us. It was through the help of another missionary (Dave and Ruthann) couple that the court issued the landlord and the family a restraining order. The problem did not all cease but we were able to have services and continue to live in the parsonage. Praise God.... Because of HIS grace we continue to have services and



We are looking for someone to loan us the money to build. Rentals are expensive, but my Dad will allow us to build on his property.
