First and foremost, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to our heavenly Father for allowing us to be part of the ministry here in the municipality of Wone, Pohnpei. Thank you, church family and individuals, for your prayers and for partnering with us in the Lord's work. I always remind myself that prayer is not the least we can do for each other; it is the most incredible privilege to come into the presence of God and intercede for others.

At one point in his ministry, Paul felt like giving up, but God encouraged him. One of the encouragements, particularly in Acts 18, was for Paul not to quit because of the salvation of the people in Corinth. I praise the Lord that He sustained and encouraged us through His people. We have witnessed people being saved and growing in the Lord. Our mission is to evangelize and disciple people. Please pray for those who have come and gone, either leaving the island or abandoning their faith due to the enticements of sin.

And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved. In our previous letters, we have requested that God would add another family from the community to His church. Please pray that we remain faithful in this endeavor.
