**Dear Pastors & Praying Friends,**

Thank you for your continual prayers. We thank the Lord for His protection on our furlough. God has blessed us with a vehicle this furlough, and for the most part, it has run very well. Over the past couple of months, we have had an issue that no one could figure out. At certain times, the car would start to vibrate, but anytime a mechanic would take it for a ride, the car would run smoothly. After worrying about the issue, God challenged my heart with Philippians 4:6, "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." So, a day before our single longest drive of our furlough, I cast my cares upon Him. We were driving from Michigan to Atoka, Tennessee, and as we drove, the problem became worse. By the time we arrived at the church, anytime you tried to accelerate the car would shake. Megan began to worry. I was thankful, because now a mechanic would be able to find what was wrong with the car. It was a CV joint, which was easily repaired, and we were on our way that Monday. Isn't God good? Too often, we worry about things that we are unable to fix, instead of taking them to God. Someone once said, "Don't worry about something you can change, change it; and don't worry about something you can't change, pray about it!"

Thank you for your prayers and support. God has blessed us with two new supporting churches. We are about finished with our furlough and have only ten meetings left. The whole family is ready to go back to Kosrae, but this winter weather has really helped that desire even more. We have at least six inches of snow on the ground, and that is enough for us. The girls love seeing the snow, but don't like how cold it is outside. We are ready for the 90 degrees and 90 percent humidity.

Back in Kosrae, there has been a lot of drinking going on, and that always causes problems. Many car accidents have taken place, and dad says the coolest new thing is for the high school students to come to school drunk. The drug and alcohol problem in Kosrae is starting to lead to worse and worse crime. As a very religious people, Kosrae does not need more religion. They need Christ. We now have Muslims on Kosrae who have secured land and are planning to build. Please pray the Gospel of Christ continues to break through to those that do not know Christ. Jeffery Charlie contacted me this past month to give me names of family members and to ask if someone would go and share the Gospel with them. Raleigh has been going to discipleship classes and a soul winning class, so that he can one day return to Kosrae and share the Gospel with his lost family. Please continue to pray for these two men and their growth in Christ!
