Our girls got involved and they also brought a bag of candy to hand out to the children.



Christmas is the most celebrated holiday in Kosrae, but for the believer, Resurrection Sunday is far more important. Most of the people look at Easter as just another Sunday, so we decided to make it a special day. We had a normal service with dinner on the grounds. Four Chinese men showed up to see how we celebrate our holidays. Please pray for these men as we have been witnessing to them. One of them has a wife who, as he puts it, "believes in Jesus!"
