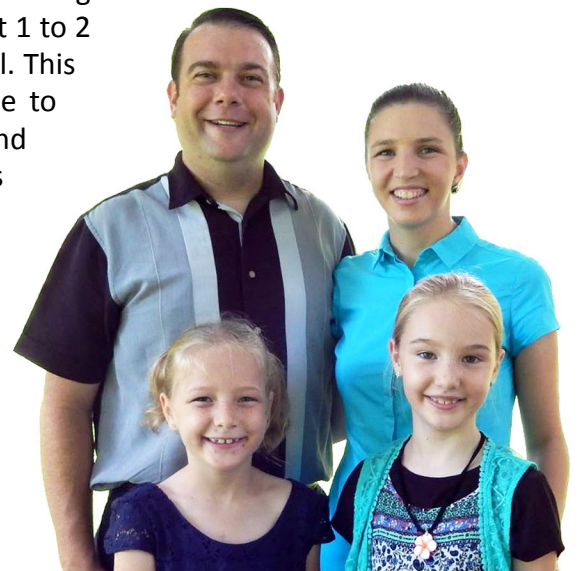

A week and a half ago, the main generator that powers our island went down. The blame has been placed on the Chinese fishery, but that may just be an excuse. During the first week, they ran the backup, but it has been overheating and shutting down as well. Last Sunday, the generator finally broke down, and we had two hours of power over the next two days. Thankfully, one of our supporters helped us purchase a small generator that helps keep our food from going bad. We now have power for 8-hours a day and are waiting on a part due to arrive March 6th or 13th.

During this week, we had our 'king tides,' which are the highest tides of the year. On Monday night, our church was flooded due to the tides and the large amounts of rain. Praise the Lord; there is not much damage, just about 1 to 2 inches of mud throughout the main auditorium and our fellowship hall. This flood also knocked out the water to our church, so we were unable to clean up the mess. Thankfully, we were able to get the water on, and some of our people volunteered to help clean up. It was really gross stuff, being that the water flowed through our neighbor's pigpen before it entered the church. Please pray as we are still cleaning up!
