When everything was said and done, it only cost about a third of the normal price.

In the next couple of months, we will be traveling in Ohio, Michigan, Tennessee, and North Carolina. Please pray that we would have good meetings. We are also visiting a few new churches as well. We have had some excellent new meetings and have been very blessed everywhere that we have been. Please continue to pray for our furlough.

We have had great reports from Kosrae. Since we have been gone, they had a couple of send-offs. One of our youth has left to join the army. Dalton is now in boot camp, and we would ask for your prayers for him. Another has left for college, so please remember to pray for Cruz as well. Brandy started the youth back up, and it sounds as though things are going well.

A couple of weeks ago, we received some contact from Brandy. He and his family needed to get back to Pohnpei. We were able to get them back home and need your prayers for our church. We are looking at a few different options, but for now, one of our men in the church is holding down the fort. William is asking for prayer as he is far outside his comfort zone. Pastor Henry from Malem is helping out and possibly some of the men from his church.

We have had some sickness in the church. One of our faithful ladies had to leave the island for some medical help. Stephan, who is one of our faithful teenagers, fell out of a breadfruit tree. He has some issues with his shoulder, but they were able to help him on island. Over the past few years, we have seen several people killed by falling out of a breadfruit tree. We are thankful that he is ok, but still healing up. Please continue to pray for our people back in Kosrae.
