## **Dear Pastors and Praying Friends,**

First of all, we hope and pray that you are all safe and also want to thank you for your faithfulness during this difficult time. We truly appreciate your prayers and support! We don't take it lightly that you continue to think of us, even amid great troubles.

As a family, we are doing well. Thank you for your prayers for Megan; she is feeling much better. Also, we appreciate the prayers for the diesel-leaking ship. From February to June, the trade winds blow in our direction. Since writing our last prayer letter, I have only seen them blow our direction one day! We are so thankful we serve God, Who controls the wind and the waves.

On the Covid-19 side of things, we have had no confirmed cases within all of the Federated States of Micronesia. Because of this, they have cut off all passenger flights at this time. The U.S. Embassy sent word before the last plane, and all Mormons left. Just before they left, one of their families visited our church. The mother and children continue to come. We have been looking at this as an opportunity since we are part of only a handful of Americans who have stayed.

Our mail service was cut off for some time, but now we are receiving mail-only flights. This has caused our mail service to work better than before. But we also have a large prayer request! All of our main stores buy their food from the States, and food leaving the States has largely been reduced. The suppliers for our stores are not even allowing them to purchase food at this time. We still have one shipment on the way—in mid-May—but after that, the stores don't know what to do.

We have stocked up as best we can with what we can order on Amazon. We are praying that things will get back to normal soon. It is time to go local and enjoy the many kinds of bananas, breadfruit, fish, and crabs. We are thankful to be in a place where it is possible to live off the land.

Because of no confirmed cases, we have continued to have services as normal. Over the past couple of months, we have averaged over thirty children in our Sunday School class. On Easter Sunday, we had forty children in one class. It is time that we split them up, and we are planning to use three men from our church to do so. There are some more men who I would like to use, but they still need your prayers. We see results in some of them, so thank you for praying!

Reed—who accepted Christ last year—started teaching in our Kid's Clubs on Saturday. He has done a great job, and the children love him. Reed will be one of our new Sunday School teachers as well. Pray for him as he continues to grow in the Lord. We have had two men visiting since the beginning of the year. Both men need Christ, and we have talked with both of them. We are praying that God will continue working on

their hearts.

We have had a lot of funerals that were related to our church. Namiko Jack, who had been a member of Calvary in Malem for many years, just recently passed away. Please pray for the family.
