Dear Pastors & Praying Friends,

This is a very difficult prayer letter for me to write. Over the past three weeks, Megan's health has really gone downhill. She has had some issues over the past couple of years, but they have never stayed like this. We have been to our very limited hospital many times now. We have seen three different doctors; each has had a different opinion on what is wrong (one suggesting that the problem is me). We have done every test possible in Kosrae and have found no answers.

But, praise the Lord, our monthly flight comes this week, and we will be on it. This is a difficult time for us because there is no timetable regarding when the government will allow people back into Kosrae. They are talking about waiting until a quarantine building is finished, but they have only started clearing the land where they plan to build it. If it wasn't for the serious nature of Megan's health, we were perfectly content being stranded in Kosrae.

Please pray for Megan's health, all the paperwork to be completed, safe flights, and a quick return to Kosrae. We have some papers to show what has been tested here already, but pray for wisdom on finding the right place for us to go first. Megan is really fatigued at this time and wears out very fast. Our flight requires us to go to Guam first, making our trip three days' worth of travel time.

Pastor Henry from Calvary Baptist in Malem and one of his men from their church will be preaching our Sunday morning services. We have plans to try a video service for some of our regular evening services; this way, we can keep in better contact with our church. We pray that God will help us all to grow more during this time.

Each of our core members is going through trials right now. One lost the roof of their house. A close relative to many in our church died, and others have health problems, etc. But it is in these difficult times that we learn to lean more on Christ. Isaiah 26:3 says, "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee."

In our last letter, we talked about splitting our Sunday School, and it is going well. The three men who volunteered to help are excited about teaching. One told me that he couldn't wait until it is his turn to teach

again (it is either that he is enjoying teaching or doesn't enjoy my preaching). The children seem to enjoy the change. Now class sizes are in a better place so

that each child can hear and learn the Word of God.

Thank you for your continued prayers and support. We had a great blessing from our home church, which shipped us a large amount of food. At this time, our house is better stocked than most of the stores here in Kosrae. Thankfully, most of it will last until we get back. We truly appreciate your prayers and will update as soon as we know more.
