Dear Pastors & Praying Friends,

Psalms 46:10 says, "Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth." This verse has a new meaning in our lives and many of yours. I have always prided myself in having things all planned out, yet uncertain times require us to lean on and know our God more than in the controlled times. Corrie ten Boom may have said it best, "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God."

We have received word of an inbound flight on May 13. This flight would be the first since March 2020 and seems to signal some progress. This flight will only be landing in Pohnpei, FSM, and is yet to be confirmed. The FSM legislature has continued to postpone these flights, but this one is designated for stranded medical patients, students, top-level diplomats, and medical personnel who would help with personnel shortage and ventilator training.

According to this update, they will require everyone coming into the FSM over 18 years old to be fully vaccinated. They also require a 14-day pre-quarantine and two negative Covid tests, along with another 14-day quarantine and two negative Covid tests after arriving. As of April 3rd, 26% of the population has received their first dose of the vaccine; only 17% have received their second dose. Again, their goal is to be 70% vaccinated before allowing regular flights to continue.

This new information shows progress, but still not a clear timeframe for our return. Yet we serve a God that knew all of this before we even left Kosrae. His plan and purpose have not been changed or spoiled because of these restrictions.

One of the areas of blessing has been the growth within our church. Reed is a young man who was saved in 2019. He has been on my mind about helping with the teaching and preaching in my absence. When we left, he said that he was not ready or comfortable in this role. Since February, we have been praying about him helping out with our Wednesday night Bible study, and he is now willing to do so. Please pray for him and this new responsibility.

Virgie has been a faithful Filipina in our church for several years now. Recently one of her sons, who was living in the Philippines, passed away. She was able to return home and is now with the rest of her family. Please pray for her and the family as they deal with this great loss.

Thank you for your continued prayers concerning Megan's health! We have seen improvements, but the issues are still ongoing. We also appreciate your faithful prayers and support of our ministry. Your prayers continue to help:

- Our people and ministry in Kosrae
- Our return to Kosrae
- Megan's health and recovery
