The beginning of the summer was not as busy as usual on the traveling side, but it was still busy as the Lord provided and opened the door for us to do a pretty big home improvement project here at home. Originally we had planned to edit the video for the school in Iraq over the summer, however we were asked to put off editing that video until some additional plans are put in place for the school. During the month of August we traveled to North Carolina where we were able to film a short video for Ambassador Baptist College as well as a deputation video for the Windnagle family going to South Korea. Often we don't share this style of video since we are using a large majority of pictures and footage from the missionary rather than footage we captured ourselves. However, we do

want to share this video with you since it is representative of many missions videos the Lord allows us to make. We want to help lift the load for each missionary we can help, but we continue to pray that the Lord would allow us more opportunities to go to the mission field to make these videos.

Shortly after our trip to NC, we also travelled to Groton, MA to present our ministry. Earlier in the year, God allowed me to connect online with Pastor Aaron in an amazing way; we were grateful for the opportunity to meet him in person and present our work at First Baptist Church.



September was a whirlwind as we assisted evangelist Chris Miller with another Hope for America Areawide Crusade here in Pennsylvania. This was the second crusade in this area, and the Lord did so many special things. These crusades take at least 3 weeks as we help to prepare for the crusade, participate in the crusade itself and then edit videos after the crusade. We are grateful for the opportunity to be involved and to see God work in lives. Many people were saved, and many more made decisions for Christ.





One of the highlights of the crusade was the first responder night. We were honored that approximately 50 first responders came to the service. Many of them were unsaved, and that night one young first responder accepted Christ.



Another highlight was the special outreach night where Evangelist David Corn preformed 3 illusion shows and then shared the gospel at the end of each show. We had a combined attendance of nearly 2,000 people!

Recently we spent several days at Martinsville Baptist Tabernacle and Christian School. One of the purposes of this trip was to produce a music video with some of the students from the school. We worked with 19 girls at a beautiful location to record the song "It Is Well" by Wren Watson. The girls did great singing through the song at least 14 times as we captured all the footage to create the video. We have finished editing the video and hope to share it in our next update letter after it is publicly released by the school.
