SHARING A NEED

I want to take a moment to share a pressing need with you. The fundamental element of our ministry is the footage we capture. Without the footage, we cannot produce videos that tell the story of missions.

When we capture footage, it is our intention to keep it forever so that we can make revisions to videos in the future or even use it for entirely different video projects. Keeping all of our footage forever means that we have accumulated a large amount of data. Recently, we have realized how important it is to properly store and back up this data. In the last 3 years, we have had 3 hard drive failures or malfunctions. One failure caused us to lose data. The second two, we were able to recover the data from backups, but both cost time, effort, and even money to recover the data.

We have decided that it is time to move to a business-grade storage solution for all of our data, as well as a better backup solution at a second physical location. We have sought the advice of a trusted friend with experience with this kind of technology, and he has recommended equipment that we believe will be the right solution for our needs.

The system will be easily expanded to provide more storage capacity in the future, but the initial start-up equipment will cost around \$3,000.
