- Watching Mr. Pinnix preach to a much larger group of people at the funeral than in any previous service.
- Filming a young family who traveled with us on this trip, who are committed to serving in Remote Alaska in the coming years, and will need a deputation video in the near future.

After returning from Stevens Village, Mr. Pinnix and I packed our bags and flew from Anchorage to Ketchikan, Alaska. From there, we boarded a Ferry for the 3-hour trip to Prince of Wales Island. Our goal for this trip was to capture video footage that would highlight an area of Alaska that is geographically much different than the rest of Alaska, and yet, much like the rest of Alaska, is in desperate need of more Gospel laborers.

Please continue to pray for this Alaska documentary. While there is still much work to be done, we are making good progress and are asking for the Lord's guidance as we get closer to completing this project.

Upon my return from Alaska, we spent a week in Tennessee filming a promotional video for Mount Pisgah Christian Academy. We have produced videos for the ministries of Mount Pisah Baptist Church in the past and enjoyed working with these friends once again.

Much of September was spent in Cleveland, Ohio, as we participated in another Hope for America Crusade led by Evangelist Chris Miller. We led the live stream ministry, produced videos for social media, created a recap of the event, and helped in other areas of the ministry as needed.

It was a joy to see God work in the lives of Christians, and many lost received Christ.

After the crusade, we enjoyed a few days at home before heading to Virginia, where we assisted the Kelley family with their furlough video.
