To die is gain... Philippians 1:21. April 2022.

Dear Praying friends, We greet you in the name of our living Lord, Jesus Christ.

We are looking forward to have Luke and Charlotte Crockett on board in terms of church planting. Keep the James Herringson family in prayer as their work permit has not processed yet.

Please continue to pray as we still look for land that will be the site of the Victory Baptist Church. Prices of land has gone up so much since Covid years. But the vision of a church building is still strong.

Our health is as good as can be. We are not as young as we used to be. We are thankful that we can still keep busy in the Lord's work. We get weary in the work but not of the work. We are ever thankful to the Lord in your faithful prayers and support of our ministry. May the Lord continue to bless you with purposeful living for Christ and profitable daily dying and may we we find death to be gain because of the living Christ and Lord.
