Prayer Requests: > For Airport Needs: ~ for the LORD to enable us to dismantle two of the three remaining Quonset hangars, and secure the remaining one for storm/wind stresses. If He provides two new Quonset type hangars to replace these, we can remove that third one. We would also need a smaller one to house our tractor and equipment. ~ For adding a "lean-to" onto our existing maintenance hangar for all the heavy shop equipment. ~ For the repainting of our maintenance hangar and the resealing of the roof. ~ For resurfacing of the runway... that's a big item. ~ For a new hangar if the LORD so leads and provides... that's a bigger item. ~ For upgrading of our runway lights. ~ For the LORD's will and His possible direction concerning building new aircraft here.

> For the Cessna 206 airplane that we have to deploy to the mission field of the LORD's choice. There are two possibilities at this time... Puerto Rico and Alaska. This is the plane that came back from Venezuela.

> For safety in flight training with three students in the next few months, and for their comprehension and abilities.

> For Missionary Dave Crispell's Cessna airplane that is covered in snow and ice in northeastern Pennsylvania. It needs to come to MA for corrosion repair, paint touch-up, and for landing gear problems to be sorted out.

> For additional staff needs that the LORD would choose to serve with us here.

> For neighbors and friends that need to be saved, as well as lost loved ones.


> For our personal witnessing and soul-winning, and the opportunity to conduct Bible studies in some homes.

> That the Hunt's would be a real blessing to those missionaries that we have the wonderful opportunity to serve, and that Christ would be honored by our lives.
