In June, we hit the ground running with meetings in Maryland, New Hampshire and North Carolina. While we were in North Carolina, we made a trip down to Ocala, FL where we attended World Wide's annual Family Fellowship Week. We enjoyed some good fellowship and wonderful preaching that was both convicting and encouraging. After the conference, we spent more time with Charity's grandma as we had a few more meetings in the Carolinas before heading home.

Our next meeting brought us back to Michigan. We decided to make the trip a few days early to visit my (Stephen's) family since only my mother had met Noah, but the main reason we made was to witness to my grandma and father.
