The young man was saved and baptized. Unfortunately, I had to tell Shawn he couldn't come anymore for several reasons and soon the young man followed him and stopped coming as well. A couple of weeks ago, I got a phone call from him telling me Shawn had passed away from a drug overdose. He had previously made the decision to stay away from Shawn a little while before he passed. The young man shared that he was getting away from drugs and had moved to a new sober living house where the manager of the house actually seems to do much better running a tight ship. He has expressed to me his desire to get back into church and follow Christ.

One of the first people to visit our church was Betty. Betty was elderly and had some physical issues that kept her from being in church much. She came a couple of times but faithfully supported the church financially. Her son Tony lived with her and also came to church a couple of times but previously did not show much desire to attend. Sadly, this past year, Betty passed away. The same week, Tony had wanted his mom to take him to the movies rather than to church. After his mother's death, Tony lost his usual joy and his family really noticed. Tony contacted me with a desire to start coming to church and has faithfully been coming every Sunday since. After the first week of his coming to church, Tony's family noticed his joy return. Through this we have been able to make contact with different members of Betty's family. We are specifically praying that Tony's sister's granddaughter Brittany will come to church. Charity had previously met her not even knowing the connection.

In January, we were blessed to have missionaries Michael and Moana Ward for one of our services. They were such a blessing!

We are looking forward to the coming celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord. This year, I decided to do something a little different. We are planning to have my father-in-law fly out in April to present to the church a Passover Seder showing Jesus as the fulfillment of everything the Messiah was meant to be, the Perfect Passover Lamb! Please pray as we invite people for this special dinner that so perfectly points to our Savior.
