He was given the Gospel but did not seem to want to make a decision at the time. At the moment, he is in rehab wanting to stay there as long as he can to build some trust with his family again. He should be going home in a couple of weeks; we are looking forward to seeing him at church and following up with him about making a decision about his salvation. Please pray for this young man as he seeks to free himself from drugs and follow Christ as well as for this to have an impact on the spiritual state of his family.

We praise the Lord for the spiritual growth we have seen in many of our church members. We have one couple who took over a Cub Scout pack that dissipated after Covid. They have been trying to rebuild and have hit some difficulties. There was quite a large group in the beginning but many dropped out due to finances and a little bit of drama.
