Pastors and Prayer Partners,

Time has gotten away from us once again. It seems impossible that we are already at the end of the year. Yet here we are. We trust that everyone had a blessed Thanksgiving. We hosted Thanksgiving at our house. Every year, the missionaries try to get together and have a big Thanksgiving dinner together. It helps us not miss our families as much. When you are on the mission field, the other missionaries become like family to you. Last year, we hosted it as well, and we had four missionary families here. Our house was busting at the seams, but this year, it was just two families because the other two were home on furlough.

The Christmas season will be very busy for us this year. We are going to have an anniversary Sunday on the 15th. We have been in our church building for a year on the 17th. We are having a guest speaker preach and then dinner on the grounds. We are excited to be celebrating our first year as a church. We look forward to hearing some good preaching and having a good time of fellowship afterwards. Then, the very next Sunday will be the Sunday before Christmas. Tonya has been working with her class. They will be singing a special for the anniversary Sunday, and the following week they will sing another special for Christmas.

We are excited to tell you that money was donated to finish our building. We are praying that it will be completely finished for our anniversary service. They are putting in the auditorium windows tomorrow and finishing up the electrical wiring for the auditorium as well. We have been meeting in one large Sunday School room at the back of the church because it was the only place with electricity. When the hot season arrives in Ghana, you need those ceiling fans running! It will be nice to spread out a little when we move into the auditorium. When you have 40 to 50 people in that Sunday School room, it can get a little crowded. I will try to include pictures of our finished building and anniversary service in the next prayer letter.

The elections are being held here on December 7th. Pray that it will be a peaceful election and transition for the new president. The current president has already served two terms, so this is his last term.

I mentioned the electricity issues in my last prayer letter. For a while, our power was out almost every day for four to eight hours. Praise the Lord, it is finally getting better. I think it has been a week since the last time it was out.

We had to buy a generator for the church because we were waiting for the electric company to put our meter on. They said it could be a three to six month wait. They agreed to put in a temporary meter until the permanent one could be installed. Right now, Ghana is revamping its electrical meters for the whole country, so meters are in high demand. The new ones are supposed to be digital and less hassle to deal with. We are looking forward the less hassle part.
