The weather has been cooling, traffic has died down on the Autobahn, and everything slowly returns to normal. God gave us a great summer! We have been staying busy in the ministry, and seen the Lord doing some great things. This past June, we had an evangelistic outreach with Dr. Markus Blietz. It was a wonderful evening of science and creation teaching, and we saw about 60 folks come and listen to the lecture. We also had an intern from a German Bible college spend a week with us in June and we were able to attend some biblical counselling seminars in Bonn and Munich. On July 12th we baptised a teenager in our church and enjoyed a wonderful Lord's Day! We also had an end of school year musical program put on by our kids. Steffi and Daniel Kraus did a great job of organising the day and we were greatly blessed! In August we had our annual teen/children's camps. Julia and I are counsellors and teachers at the camp. This year's theme was the Book of Acts and how it relates to the local church. We were also invited to Romania this year to speak at a youth conference in Brihen. Our German church has supported a young pastor there for several years, and it was a delight to be able to both serve in and see his ministry. On the trip there we spent the night with some friends in Budapest, Hungary, and saw first hand the refugee/migrant crisis unfolding there and across Europe. As we see this influx of people surging into Europe, we will be looking for opportunities to reach them with the Gospel of Christ! Please pray that the Lord opens doors for us. On the 25th of August we were joined by Jennifer Andrews. She will be here studying German and serving in our church for a couple of years. Her heart is to head toward Liechtenstein after she has a grasp of the German language. She has already been a blessing in her short time here.
