The last few months have flown by as we have served our Lord here in the beautiful land of Germany. We have been truly blessed to see the Lord strengthening His church and are excited about what God is doing in Bavaria!

In April, we had a 2 evening lecture series with Dr. Markus Blietz. Dr. Blietz is an astrophysicist who came to Christ about 8 years ago. He travels over much of Germany sharing valuable information about science and the Bible, and we were blessed to have him with us for 2 evenings this year. The event was well visited from area churches, and we also had some local visitors from the surrounding towns come and listen.





In May, we were privileged to host the choir from

Faith Baptist Bible College as they performed a concert for us. In the morning before the concert we took all 27 of them on a short tour of the nearby city of Regensburg. While we were in the cathedral, we asked if they would be allowed to sing a song in the church. The caretaker agreed, and we were astounded as everything in the cathedral came to a stop while people came to the front to listen. We were able to invite several to the evening concert, and one family

made the trek out to our area to hear the choir again. They truly did an amazing job, and even better, there were several opportunities after the concert to share the Gospel with some of the visitors. Please pray that we will be able to continue following up on these contacts and that the Lord will continue drawing these dear people to Him!

In June, we were saddened by the passing of one of our church folks. Peter Adelmann was 53 years old and had been attending for about the last 3 years. I was privileged to be able to hold the funeral and share
