The end of last year brought us to our annual Christmas outreaches in our area. We held a Christmas play in two area nursing homes and also visited our local Christmas market to pass out gifts and tracts. In addition, we took our teens to a nearby city

where some good friends are in the process of starting a church (Neumarkt i.d. Oberpfalz). In January we kicked off the year with our theme for 2017: "Ye shall be witnesses unto me..." We are emphasizing evangelism this year and looking for ways to reach our small and very Catholic area with the good news of a living Savior! Julia's parents were able to come visit us as well. Unfortunately, Julia's grandmother's health began declining while they were here, and Julia's father had to cut his visit short to go home and care for her. Grams Kendrick passed away in February. Moving forward, they will be a fully independent Baptist church reaching the Regensburg-Neutraubling area. We are so excited to see God working! We have several upcoming

There will be several independent Baptist churches in Bavaria joining us on our property for a day of refreshment and encouragement. As of yesterday, there were over 220 people registered to come. We are not a large church and hosting this takes a lot of manpower, but I am so thrilled to see our folks up to the task and everyone pitching in.
