Trip to Babo

Several months ago, during one of the quarterly Pastor's fellowship, a national Pastor named Daniel asked me to come and preach to his congregation about the church supporting its pastor. Earlier this month, I had the privilege to travel to the village of Babo, which is about four hours north of where we live. Another national pastor heard of the upcoming



trip and wished to accompany me. This was convenient because I had no idea how to get to that village and, at the same time, I now had a friend to fellowship with along the journey. During our time there I enjoyed touring the village, playing with the children, handing out donated dresses for little girls, grinding millet, eating wild cat, fellowshipping with the folks of the church and trying to encourage the ministry there. We arrived on a Saturday and I preached on Sunday morning out of Hebrews 13:17. This study encouraged me as I was reminded that as the Lord leads, we will have the privilege to start a church, see it mature in Christ and understand the position of the pastor in the church. We returned to Ouagadougou Sunday afternoon, after which i began preparing for another trip.

Mission Trip to Ivory Coast

After coming back from a weekend in Babo, I was invited to travel to Ivory Coast on a ten day trip with brother Keith Shumaker. We took several of the national pastors with us, and enjoyed fellowship, different foods, and many good church services. While there, Brother Keith preached for a missions Conference, and we visited earlier works that had been started and are still going strong while He ministered in Ivory Coast. I was asked to preach in a small village on Sunday morning, but could not make it because I became ill from eating too much local foufou and foutou. Adjusting to new foods is a difficult reality- keep praying for us in this matter! This trip also gave me the opportunity to visit different ministries that were started by other missionaries and that had been transitioned to national pastors. It was a valuable experience learning from well established ministries in other parts of West Africa. I came home encouraged for the work of the Lord in Burkina Faso and cannot wait to see what will happen in the future!
