It was encouraging to see several teenagers making life changing decision to remove things that hindered them in their walk with the Lord. Along with the readjustment to the environment and weather, the food and lifestyle at camp was typically African, which put us directly back into the swing of African living.

Vacation Bible School

One of the missionary families here in Burkina, the Garcias, is from Mexico. They have been great friends to us this last year. At youth camp, they were telling us that they planned a week of Vacation Bible School in two different areas of the capital city. We automatically desired to help and learn from this Bible School. Many teenagers from different churches who attended youth camp also
