In other news, I mention before in my last prayer letter about a girl named Diana Ortega, she has been in the hospital for almost three months. She had some issues with her liver. She has had multiple surgeries during that time. The doctors have had to take about 80% of her liver off due to an infection she had. She is now having to live the life as a diabetic. Sister Diana is around twenty-two years old recently married, and with a one-year-old child, it was a very difficult time for her family to go through this at such a young age.
