Dear Friends,

March/April

It has been busy here in the Solomon Islands. April was the national election month which



means there was a lot of school breaks and work holidays, so people could go home to their villages to vote. Auki was very busy for several weeks. For several weeks, we had one person come on Sunday. It was a different person every Sunday. We rejoiced that for the last Sunday of April we had 14 people, not including our family, come to

service. Everyone has returned to Auki and we are continuing work. As far as the elections went, there was a lot of tension in the country. The last Prime Minister was not popular with many of the

people on our island. He was not re-elected, but someone from the same political party was elected as Prime Minister. We are thankful that the rioting was minimal.

The English class has had lower attendance the last couple of weeks, but those who have been coming are progressing well. Also, Colton has been able to have some really

good discussions in Theology class as he has covered the topic of Christology and is bringing to teach Bibliology.

Melodie has been meeting weekly with a lady (E) for a time of discipleship and prayer. E has given a clear salvation testimony and has been faithful in church attendance. E also has been a big blessing by cleaning the church weekly in her own free time.

Melodie hopes to be able to meet with some more ladies who have been attending.

Colton has been individually meeting with some men who have been coming to church for discipleship. We have met several individuals who have given a clear salvation testimony, but do not have a church to call home. We have been praying the Lord will use us in their lives to disciple them and see their faith grow and them come to church.

The beginning of May marks six months for us in the Solomon Islands. We are so thankful for the ministry that the Lord has already opened up for us. We have many individuals on our hearts that we meet often in town that we are praying will come to salvation. We are also excited for the acceptance into the small community where we live outside of Auki Town. Within the three months the we have lived here, we have been





invited to two local weddings. Everyone in the community is invited to a big feast after the ceremony. This feast rivals even a good potluck, minus the potatoes =)

Douglas is making lots of friends, and especially loves playing with 3 brothers that have been attending church. He is beginning to say things in Pijin and can understand it fairly well. George is growing up way too fast! He has started to walk and now gets into all sorts of trouble. Thankfully, he is cute.

Thank you all who prayed for Colton's rash. It seems to be gone for the most part. We are planning to purchase a keyboard and another acoustic guitar for the church. There are some individuals who have shown interest in playing music in church but do not have instruments of their own to use.
