We are all back in Auki!!! It is very exciting for us to be home in Auki as a family of five and continue ministry together. The boys and Colton arrived at the beginning of March as Melodie and Lottie waited in the US for Lottie's passport. Thankfully, it arrived about a week after we left and we quickly got Melodie and Lottie home!

The church is doing great! I was so encouraged the first Sunday back to see over 30 people continuing to worship and study the Bible together. We are so grateful to God for what He is doing here at Auki Baptist Church. The young man who filled my place did such a wonderful job in my absence. He, along with many others, joined together to take on the full responsibility of all the happenings of the church. There were and are, of course, situations that require my attention, but overall it was a very successful leave and return. Everyone is especially happy to have Melodie and the new baby here. Thank you for all your prayers regarding the

church. Several of our midweek programs have halted for the 2 months that I was away and I plan to start them again shortly, these would include our weekly Chinese Bible study, the twice a week open air preaching in the beetle nut market, mid-week young men's Bible study, and our mid-week ladies Bible study with Melodie.

Our house construction has continued, we have the roof, framing and concrete slab underneath is finished. We are currently working on finishing some concrete rooms underneath, then we will move to the top where we will actually live. We are building a guest room underneath the house, so if anyone would like to visit that will be finished soon. The process of getting many supplies is very laborious and has slowed things down, but that is to be expected when you live on an island away from the capital. Most of the supplies have to be ordered in the capital, delivered to a ship, the ship delivers to the wharf (dock) in Auki and then carried by 3-ton truck up to the land.

We have several new Malaitan families that have started attending services in my absence. They have begun to ask several really important questions about Salvation and I believe they will turn to Christ shortly. Pray with us that these will repent and turn to Christ. I was very excited to see an additional Chinese worker who began attending church. We have a dear Chinese couple, who are members, who have reached out to him and are working to bring him to Christ.
