Andrew and Nathaniel have adjusted well and are making new friends daily. Cilla is such a blessing to have in the family. Sometimes it's hard to believe that we are starting over raising a two year old little girl, but we praise God for the opportunity to raise her in a Christ centered home and one day be able to point her to Christ. What a blessing!! We can hardly wait for furlough so each of you can meet her.

We have some great news to report! First, we have graduated from our first language class. We still have a ways to go, but it has given us a good foundation to build upon. Being a Southern country boy I guess I'll always have a Southern Pohnpeian accent. Secondly, and even greater news, two more Pohnpeians have come to know Jesus Christ as their personal Saviour. I was preaching Sunday night January 27 in the Village of Wone and a young man (in his twenties) along with a young lady (a prostitute) raised their hands and came forward for salvation. Praise the Lord!!! Please pray for them, as the Devil will be on the attack. We have good news to report about the young lady who we mentioned in our last prayer letter who had gotten saved. Her family and the people in the village say that there is something different about her. Praise the Lord!! She has been faithful to every service and has joined the Choir. Please pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to open blinded eyes to the Gospel.

Aaron arrived here on January 24 to visit with use for belated Christmas. It's a joy to be able to have him here for a while. He's going through culture shock and adjustments to the time change. I think he misses fast food but he does love the fresh tuna. We thank the Lord that he was able to come and see a little of the ministry that we are involved in. Please continue to pray for his health and God's leading in his life.

We had quite a shock a couple of Sundays ago while sitting in Sunday school class. There was a large explosion that shook the rooms we were in knocking things off the walls. Well come to find out that about a mile from where the Church is located and our house they found 2000 World War II bombs in a cave. They were taking some of them off the coast and detonating them, but the explosion were so strong that it was causing damage to peoples property. They finally evacuated the area and moved the bombs to a ship where they took them out into the ocean. It was a little nerve racking the one day, because every time they would detonate one of the bombs it would shake all the windows in our house. It was hard to believe that all these bombs were still around from World War II. We sure hope they have found them all!
